## 1. Goods Movement





- ✤ 44 Percent of all Valley Employment is associated with Goods Movement Dependent Industries (564,000 jobs)
- \$56 Billion of Region's Economy Related to Goods Movement
- ✤ Over 31,420 Miles of Roadways in SJV (second only to LA region)
- ◆ 500 Million Tons of Goods Moved Annually in SJV (90% by Truck)

#### Goods Movement



KEY ISSUE - The Valley, as a region, needs to effectively plan for efficient goods movement and successfully partner with the private sector, state and Federal agencies to make necessary investments. A failure to effectively plan and invest could result in congested and poorly maintained highways, lost economic opportunities due to inadequate access to markets, land use conflicts between logistics-oriented business and growing communities, and poor air quality due to diesel emissions.



#### SJV Interregional Goods Movement Plan



- Congestion is growing on many San Joaquin Valley facilities:
  - Key N-S corridors
  - ✤ E-W corridors
  - Local roads / "Last mile" connections

- ✤ 13 Regional Highway projects
- ✤ 13 East-west connector projects
- ✤ 3 "Last mile" projects
- ✤ 5 Alternative modal projects
- ✤ 6 Economic development projects
- ✤ 2 Inland Port projects
- ✤ 6 Strategic programs

- SJV Awarded Caltrans Partnership Planning Grant Program
  (FY 2014-15) for additional Goods Movement analysis

#### FEDERAL REAUTHORIZATION

- Current Funding (MAP 21) set to expire in October 2014
- Administration, Senate and House Currently have Proposals
- Proposals fall short in offering a "Fix" to the Highway Trust Fund which faces Insolvency in 2014
- Better Fuel Efficiency, Lower Gas Receipts are pushing the Highway Trust Fund over the Edge

#### Transportation Funding




 KEY ISSUE - The Valley, its cities and counties, as well as the state and nation face a serious problem with our transportation network that is in dire need of repair and improvement.
 Declining transportation revenues, coupled with a lack of political motivation to modify gas taxes exasperate the problem.
