

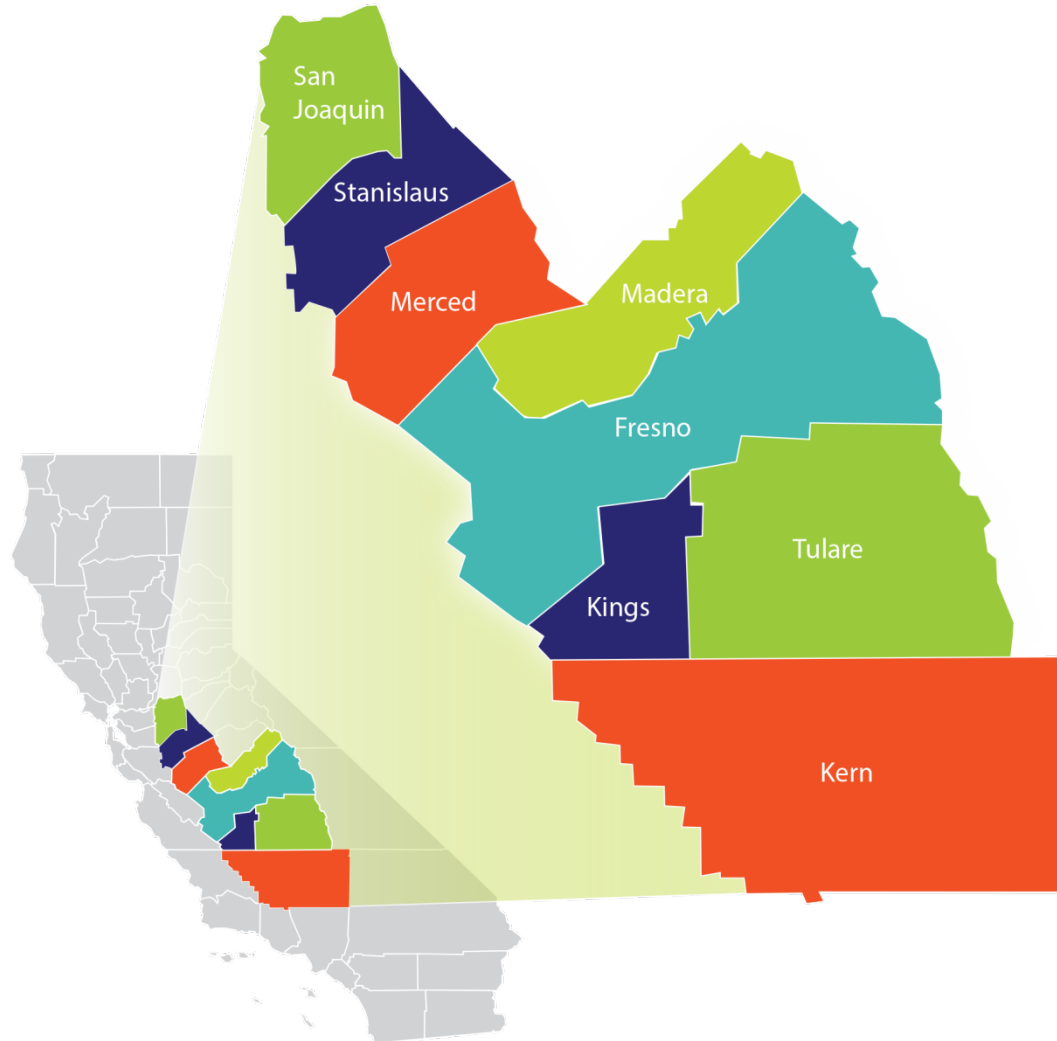
History of Strategic Action Proposal

The California Partnership for the San Joaquin Valley Strategic Action Proposal was established in 2006 following the creation of the Partnership in 2005.

In 2011, funding was depleted; the Board recommended the Plan (formerly the Proposal) be updated.

2006

State of California provides \$5 million to help initiate Partnership activity

- \$2.5 million designated for administration, Annual Summit, Annual Report
- \$2.5 million designated for 14 seed grants to assist work groups in meeting goals and objectives for years 1-3
- Each work group received at least one grant



Strategic Action Plan 2006

Vision

- San Joaquin Valley will be a cohesive region composed of unique communities and a diverse population that is supported by a vibrant economy built on competitive strengths and sufficient resources to provide a quality of life for all residents now and in the future.
- Achieved through public-private collaboration integrating actions and investments into a coherent strategy that commits immediate and sustained leadership to accomplishing specific objectives that moves towards accomplishing long term goals.
- Achieved through the three E's – Prosperous Economy; Quality Environment; Social Equity.



Strategic Action Plan 2006

10 Work Groups established

Numerous regional meetings - each work group had its own vision, goals, and objectives set up in four action steps:

- Immediate (first year)
- Short-term (2-3 years)
- Intermediate (4-6 years)
- Long-term (7-10 years)

10 Work Groups established

1. Economic Development
2. Higher Education and Workforce Development
3. K-12 Education
4. Transportation
 - later renamed Sustainable Communities
5. Land Use, Agriculture and Housing
 - later renamed Housing
6. Air Quality
7. Water Quality, Supply and Reliability
8. Energy
9. Health and Human Services
10. Advanced Communications Services (Broadband)



Strategic Action Plan 2006

Six recommendations and strategic actions were integrated which detailed recommendations from the 10 work groups:

1. Grow a diversified, globally competitive economy supported by a highly skilled workforce
2. Create a model K-12 public education system
3. Implement an integrated framework for sustainable growth
4. Build a 21st Century transportation mobility system
5. Attain clean air standards
6. Develop high-quality health and human services

Metrics

16 metrics have been used to measure Partnership progress

1. Increase per capita income
2. Increase median household income
3. Reduce unemployment
4. Reduce families below poverty line
5. Increase high school graduation rates
6. Increase college graduation rates
7. Reduce number of days with 8-hour ozone exceedances
8. Increase land-use efficiency (population/acre incorporated land)



Strategic Action Plan 2006

Metrics

9. Maintain agricultural production
10. Increase transportation mobility
11. Increase housing affordability
12. Reduce per capita energy use
13. Reduce per capita residential water consumption
14. Increase access to primary care physicians and allied health professionals
15. Reduce asthma rates
16. Reduce violent crimes

Positive results have taken place in most metric indicators



Strategic Action Plan 2006

2009

Funds provided by State of California depleted

- No mechanism in place to require or assist work groups in meeting goals set for years 4-10



Strategic Action Plan 2011

Board recommends updating Strategic Action Plan since funds are depleted, work group activity minimalized

- June 2011 quarterly meeting, board meets to create the Strategy with goals for two years
 - 10 work groups asked to submit goals that could be realized within the two years
- Work groups placed in one of three areas:
 - Job Creation
 - Infrastructure Development
 - Sustainable Planning
