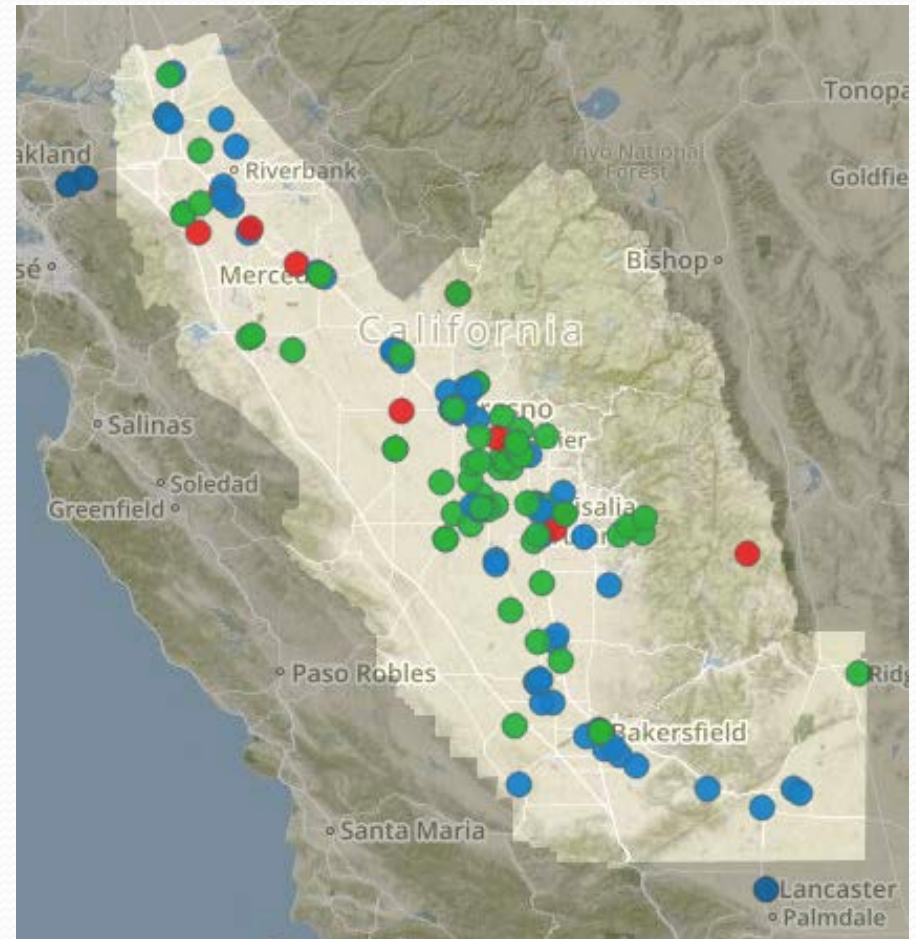

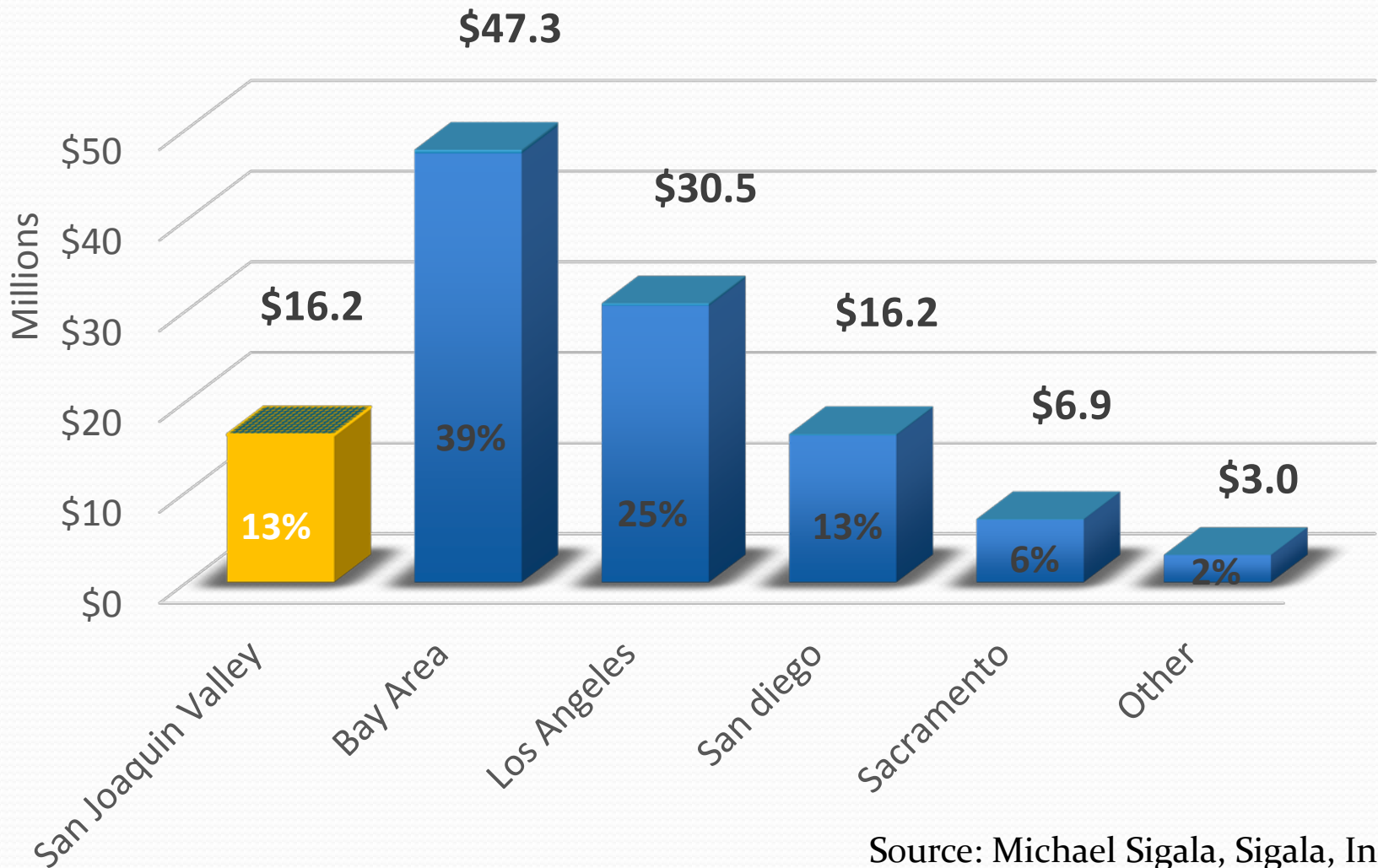

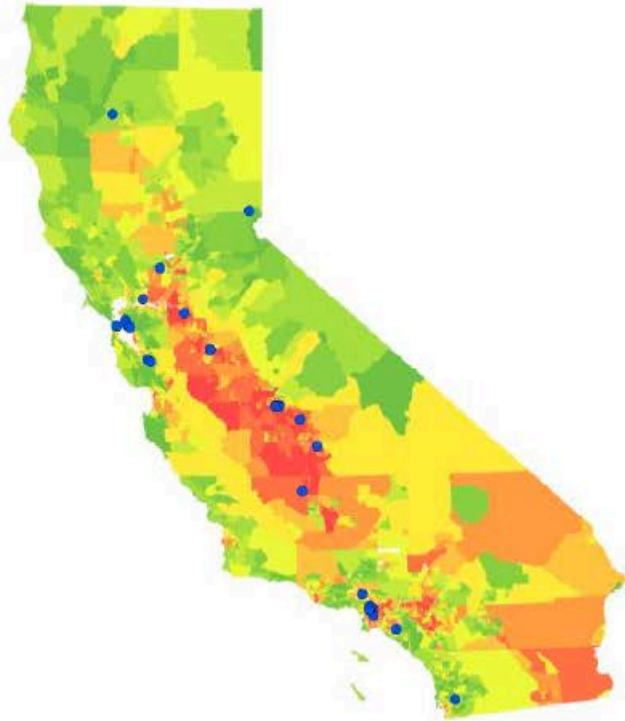

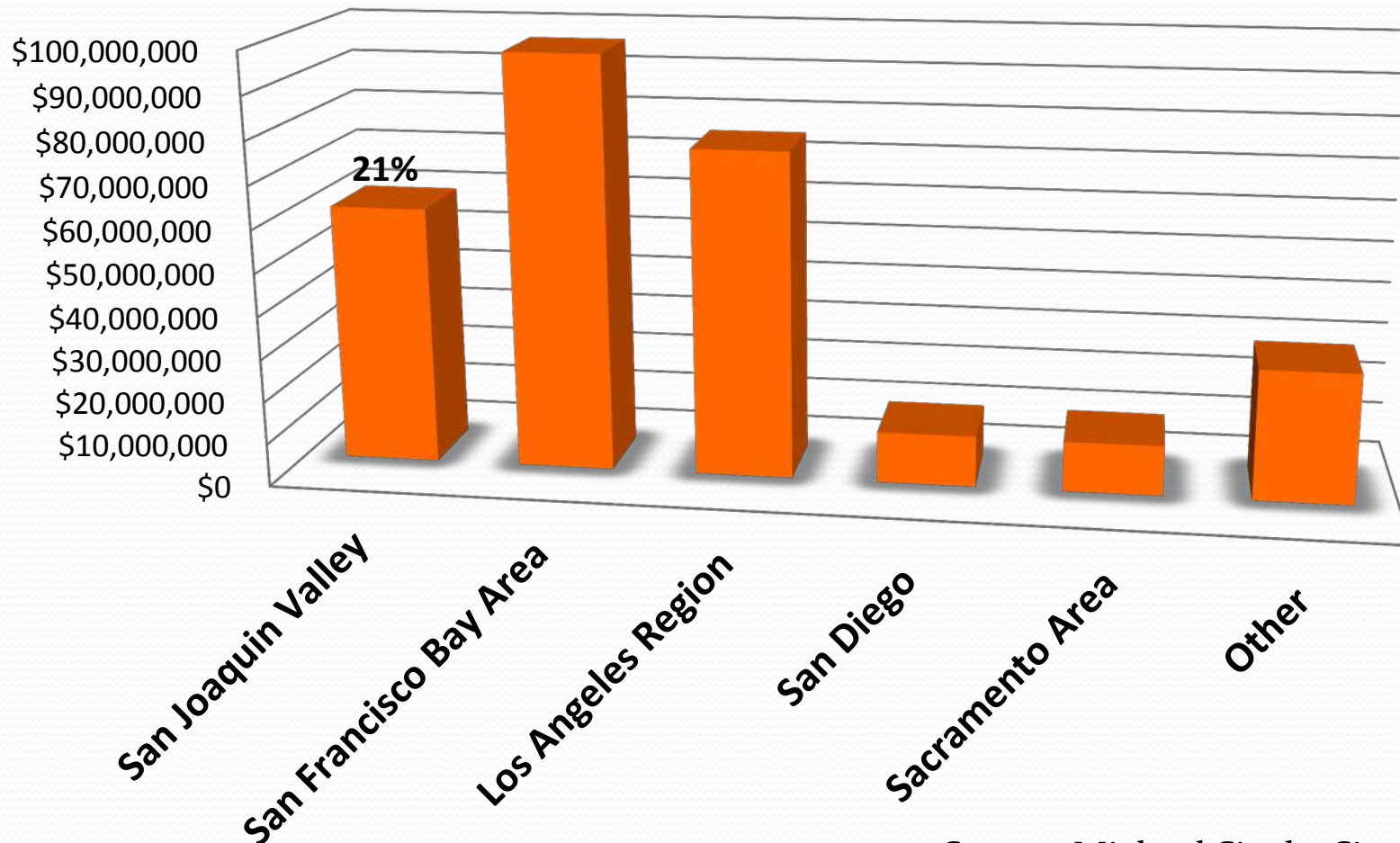

Technical Assistance Timeline

- January
 - SGC awards \$100,000 to TA team
 - SGC releases NOFA
- February
 - SGC hosts workshop (Fresno)
 - TA team begins outreach to applicants
- March
 - TA team continues outreach to applicants
 - Concept applications due March 16

Technical Assistance Timeline

- April
 - SGC sends invitations to select applicants to proceed with Full Application
 - TA team continues outreach to applicants
- May
 - TA team hosts 2 regional workshops (Visalia, Atwater)
 - Over 60 attendees
 - TA team continues outreach to applicants
- June
 - TA team continues outreach to applicants
 - Full applications due June 20

Technical Assistance Timeline

- July
 - TA team begins planning next workshop
- August
 - TA team continues planning next workshop
- September
 - SGC announces award recommendations
 - TA team continues planning next workshop

Technical Assistance Timeline

- October
 - TA team hosts regional workshop (Fresno)
 - Over 65 attendees
- November
 - San Joaquin Valley Housing Collaborative plans for fourth and final SJV AHSC workshop for the year
- December
 - San Joaquin Valley Housing Collaborative hosts regional workshop (Merced)
 - SGC hosts Guidelines Listening Session (Merced)
