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## 2018 Budget - Homelessness Efforts

### No Place Like Home program

- Release of \$190 million Non-Competitive NOFA
- Release of \$400 million Competitive NOFA

### Senate Bill 2

- Revenues from SB2 exceeding projections
- SB2 California Emergency Solutions Housing (CESH) NOFA issuance
- Housing for Healthy California draft guidelines – public comment ends December 8<sup>th</sup>
- Release of technical assistance resources - NPLH, SB2 Planning
- Ongoing collaboration with stakeholders

### Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council

- Release of \$500 million Homeless Emergency Aid Program NOFA

# CESH – California Emergency Solutions and Housing Program



- \$53 million
  - was established to make the first portion of this funding available to local governments and nonprofits in every part of the state to address homelessness. It will be followed later this year by the new AB 74 Housing for a Healthy California program, which makes available long-term rental assistance and operating support.

# Prop 2 – No Place Like Home Act

(Voters approved on the November ballot)



- \$2 billion Supportive Housing
  - Target population includes people with serious mental illness who are homeless, chronically homeless or at-risk of homelessness
